Community Bremen e.V. is invited by state council Prof. Matthias Stauch to visit the JVA Bremen on September 22nd, 2015.

In a lecture, participants will get to know the substantive work in a penal system. Various areas of the prison will be seen, including the social therapy, the department of sexual and violent offenders and pre-trial custody.

Modern buildings will be presented as well as detention houses, which were built in 1874 and are reconstructed at the moment. Participants also get to see the cottage industries to learn about the conditions under which prisoners work and which products the penitentiary Bremen produces.

6 QUESTIONS FOR...

Premen's Justice State Council Matthias Stauch was a student at the University of Bremen in the seventies. Afterwards he became administrative judge in Bremen and worked for several years as a scientific assistant at the Federal Constitutional Court. In the nineties he worked for the Senator for Finances in Bremen and in addition became chief judge in 1994. Five years later he became President of the Administrative Court of Bremen. He was appointed chairman of the Higher Administrative Court of Bremen in 2002 and served as Vice President of the Constitutional Court.

Since July 2011, Matthias Stauch is State Council for the Senator for Justice and Constitution as well as the Senator for Economics, Labour and Ports in Bremen. At the University of Bremen, he works as an honorary professor since 2008.

1. When did you study/work at the University of Bremen and why did you choose Bremen?

I studied at the University of Bremen from 1973 to 1979. I chose Bremen because of the atmosphere of transition and the multidisciplinary social science orientation of law school back then. The curiosity about social structures has never left me throughout my

professional practice since then. The study there was profound and lasting for me.

2. What was your most important experience at the University of Bremen?

My strongest memory is of the constructive and challenging learning environment with my fellow students in very energetic small groups and with our university teachers. And: Openness to other disciplines, especially for philosophy and biotopy.

3. Who or what has influenced your career the most?

The work in the unionized education and the experiences I made there affected me deeply, both personal and in the pursuit of adequate and good decisions as a judge.

4. What would you like to pass on to students at the University of Bremen?

To use this very special phase of life to engage with fundamental texts about society and history. And: To learn to write your own, clear and concise texts and to learn to talk and argue.

Steel Innovation Prize 2015 goes to University of Bremen

The German steel industry awarded a research collaboration in which the University of Bremen was significantly involved with the Steel Innovation Prize 2015. Every three years the prize is awarded in the categories "steel products", "steel in research and development", "steel in construction" and "steel design".

The collaboration project of the universities in Bremen, Aachen, Munich and Kaiserslautern is called "High Performance Components - Innovative concepts to increase the performance and reliability of highly stressed components" and was awarded in the category "Steel in Research and Development". The aim of this project is

to improve design and to develop new concepts for alloys and heat treatment for drive technology components. The designed steel materials, which are extremely resistant and nevertheless significantly insensitive to inclusions, can for example be used in gears, bearings and drive shafts.

At the University of Bre-

men, the institute for materials technology, Institut für

Werkstofftechnik, was involved in the project. Prof. Dr. Hans-Werner Zoch, one of the project's lead researchers and professor of materials engineering at the University of Bremen, as well as Managing Director of the Foundation Institute of Materials Engineering Bremen, recognizes the

importance of the project: "Damage to components are annoying and can be expensive for all users, for example as a motorist, but also as a producer. Materials which are tolerant to damage will help increase reliability, reduce default rates and in the end reduce costs. The modern steel material has considerable potential for innovation."



Alumni-Network supported Exchange Project with Moldova

Ind of April 2015, the Center for Media, Communication and Information Sciences at the University of Bremen, ZeMKI, organized an exciting exchange project: Ten students and their vice-dean from Moldova came to Bremen to get to know the local media scene, the city and the University of Bremen. There was a wide program set up for the students including visits to Radio Bremen and Sat1, events at the University and of course getting to know the city of Bremen in an interactive way.

Community bremen e.V. has financially supported the exchange and actively supported it in the form of Christoph Sodemann, board member of the Alumni Network.

even month in advance: "The Moldovans are coming!" in large, colorful letters and with a huge smile on my face. And it was worth it," Denise Hasselbrink says. She is a student of Media and Communication Studies in her 8th semester at the University of Bremen and participated in the exchange project. "The week here in Bremen

was breathtaking. Sleep? Goods in short supply! Food? Overrated! Fun? Nonstop! Whether at official events or private tours of Bremen, we got to know each other better by the minute and compared similarities and differences between our cultures. "

Following the week in Bremen, nine students from the University of Bremen travelled to Moldova to get to know the local life. Amongst other things, the students visited a public service radio station and a privately owned TV station. Also the partner university was visited. "They showed us their lives, their culture and their hospitality. They are much more similar to us

country and will try to get an internship or a semester abroad there to stay for a long time with my newfound friends and to be able to get to know the country even better", concludes Denise Hasselbrink. Meanwhile, the 24-year-old also has been selected for a summer internship at a TV station in Moldova.

University does well in the Fields of Relation to Professional Practice and Study Duration

The University of Bremen performs well in the current ranking of the Centre for Higher Education Development (CHE) and the weekly newspaper "Die Zeit" in the fields of relation to professional practice and the duration of studies. The subjects geography, earth sciences, computer science, mathematics, nursing, physics and political science were evaluated in the ranking.

The results show that geo sciences at the University of Bremen have been very successful in the acquisition of research funds as well as the computer science in the international orientation and

the promotions. Political science students are very satisfied with the support provided by teachers and the curriculum.

"Given the austerity discussions, which are well known to students, I am very satisfied with the results of the recent CHE university rankings. Despite the difficult conditions, they show the great commitment of our scientists for teaching and learning. Where there is pentup demand according to the CHE ranking, we will take a closer look and readjust," Professor Dr. Thomas Hoffmeister, Vice President for Teaching and Learning at the University of Bremen, says.

Bremen Professor Placed 4th in Nationwide Ranking as Important Political Advisor

Current research shows that economists in an advisory role have a much bigger impact on the media and also in circles of politico-economic policy makers than other scientists. In the economists ranking 2014 by the "Frankfurter Allgemeine Zeitung", Bremen's

Professor Dr. Rudolf Hickel was placed fourth as a political advisor. The assesments made by the University's economist about broad issues of political economy are in high demand.

In early May this year for example, he

spoke to around 6.000 listeners about alternatives to economic policies and minimum wage. Prof. Dr. Hickel was significantly involved in establishing the University of Bremen and in 1971 he was appointed professor of political economy with a focus on public finance.



Two years later he was appointed professor for finance. He was also Head of the Department of Labor and Economic Development at the University of Bremen from 2001 to 2009.



Red Chairs as a Sign of Togetherness University Bremen and Dickinson College celebrate 30 years of cooperation

n 29 May 1985, the first cooperation agreement between the University of Bremen and the Dickinson College in Carlisle, Pennsylvania was signed. At that time no one had certainly expected that this cooperation will last for 30 years. Since then, over 350 students from both sides of the atlantic have taken part in the program. To celebrate the anniversary in style a delegation around Dickinson President Nancy Roseman visited the University of Bre-

Almost 30 alumni of the program came to Bremen for the event, including the first participant Mathias Ziegfeld. The teacher studied from 1984-85 at the Dickinson College, a memorable time, as he showed in his presentation. Together with numerous former teachers, program staff and guests from the Dickinson College, memories were

shared.

The former rector of the University of Bremen Prof Dr Wilfried Müller attended the alumni meeting as well. Together with his colleague William G. Durden, president of the Dickinson College until 2012, they promoted the cooperation

for many years. Müller, since 2013 honorary doctorate of the Dickinson College, is sure that the long-standing trust and good cooperation is based on a similar mindset. "We're kind of

equal," he says.

Both of them did not hesitate as they were asked to support the purchase of "Dickinson Chairs". A lot of these red chairs have been on Dickinson College campus

for quite some time now. The idea to set up the same chairs as a sign of solidarity on the Bremen campus came up during the last visit in Carlisle.

Private donations should now make

the purchase of the chairs possible. For 400 euro one chair can be set up on campus and the donor will be mentioned by name on a badge on the chair. Thus it was only natural for Müller and Durden to donate a chair together. Meanwhile, further donations were assured. Community bremen e.V., Sparkasse Bremen, members of the rector's office and the president of the Dickinson College have already pledged, so a couple of chairs could already be unveiled as part of the alumni event. At the latest after the OPEN CAMPUS they will get a firm anchoring and will be permanently installed on campus.
