SCIENCE FICTION OF WIND FARMS?

Those times are long gone. Researchers of the Bremen Institute for Metrology, Automation and Quality Science (BIMAQ) study new energies in the power supply system. To this end, data of 2,000 wind turbines from 260 wind farms are analyzed in the project – for three years, and from the North Sea to Bavaria.
